


JACK RABBIT & THE DESERT TORTOISE


Jack Rabbit thought he was the fastest thing on four legs. "I can beat anybody in a race!" he boasted. And he ran right over anybody who got in his way.




Desert Tortoise grew tired of his bragging. "I'll race you," he said. "You have got to be kidding!" laughed Jack Rabbit.
"No, I'm not," said Tortoise. They agreed to race the next day.




That night Tortoise went home and got a good night's sleep. But Jack Rabbit stayed up and partied all night.






Jack Rabbit sped off leaving Tortoise behind. But Tortoise didn't even seem to mind. He just kept going.

JACK RABBIT & THE DESERT TORTOISE DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR AFTER THE SHOW

- 1. Why did the Tortoise think it was important to get a good night's sleep the night before the race? Do you try and get to bed early before a big day? Did you go to bed early last night knowing you were going to the puppet theater today?
- 2. Jack Rabbit stopped during the race to eat a prickly pear fruit (much like we might snack on a piece of candy). Later he got a stomach ache. Why do you think this happened? Is it important to eat a good breakfast every day? Did you eat a good breakfast today?
- 3. We all know that a rabbit is faster than a tortoise. But in this story, the tortoise wins the race. What happened? How did the tortoise win?
- 4. This story has a moral a special meaning that teaches us a lesson about life. Can you guess what the moral of this story is?

A Post-Show Activity


You'll need old magazines, scissors, glue and construction paper. Cut out pictures of things that you saw or head about in the puppet show (rabbits, tortoises, other animals, cactus). Cut these out and glue them on a bright piece of construction paper. Explain each picture on your collage to someone else.

MAKE YOUR OWN PUPPETS!


Make your own special rabbit and tortoise puppet.

Rabbit:

Take a fuzzy sock. The toe will be your rabbit's nose. Cut eyes, ear, nose and whiskers out of felt or construction paper. Glue them on the sock. Glue a cotton ball where his tail should be.



USE A LOW-TEMPERATURE
HOT GLUE GUN TO GLUE ITEMS
TO THE SOCK.



Tortoise: Turn a small paper bowl upside down to make a shell. Use markers, paint, and crayons to make shapes on the shell and color them in. Cut 4 legs, a pointy tail, and a rounded head out of brown construction paper. Draw eyes on the tortoise's head. Glue the flat side of the legs, tail and head to the underside of the bowl along the rim. The body parts should poke out from under the bowl like a tortoise would from under its shell.

Have fun making up your own story with your rabbit and tortoise!
